
*Title:* The Foreboding Decline of the Judiciary in Hungary and Turkey.

#### **BACKGROUND:**


## RESULTS

The research in this paper establishes that the swift sidelining of the judiciary is **more effective** for a rising autocratic regime than **slower** paced dismantling.




# Initiating judicial decay earlier allows an autocratic regime circumvent checks on their power, and use the

judiciary as a tool to enable future backsliding.







- Democratic Backsliding: The process by which a stable democracy is gradually eroded over the course of several election cycles.
- Judicial Decay: The specific erosion of judicial institutions through a series of specific strategies.
- Court Packing: Intentionally expanding a court in order to fill it with regime ideology aligned judges.
- Court Purging: Removing influential or impartial members of court system who would oppose the regime.
- Control over Applicants: Establishing control over both the applicant pool and the selection process for judicial positions.



Autocracts utilize many strategies to help them purge, pack and establish control over the court system. These include:

- Altering the **retirement age** of judges
- Abusing emergency powers
- Constitutional Restructuring
- Criminal investigations into the judiciary
- Rebuilding the bureaucracy to reduce independence from the executive.
