# Science (not so) Fiction:

H.G. Wells' contributions to social degeneration and eugenics in the context of the Holocaust

## **BACKGROUND**

Many discuss H.G. Wells as a pioneer of science fiction; some may mention his work with social degeneration and eugenics.

However, an under discussed component of Wells' work, particularly in *The Time Machine* and *Anticipations*, is *how* Wells' influence in these pseudoscience topics indirectly contributed to arguably the greatest calamity of the twentieth century:

The Holocaust.

### **KEY QUOTES**

1. Wells' in His Own Words: "...whole masses of human population are, as a whole, inferior..." (Wells, *Anticipations*, 281-282).

"The Eloi [future humanoids], like the Carolingian kings, had decayed to a mere beautiful futility." (Wells, *The Time Machine*, 93).

Wells' Influence: While Wells would attempt to later disassociate from Hitler, calling him a "certified lunatic" (Shepherd), the damage had been done. "Hitler had referenced [Wells'] *The War of the Worlds* when criticising democratic states" (Langlois).

The Time Machine "...has sold more than 8 million copies" (Union Square & Co.).


3. Social degeneration's Notoriety:


"[Oswald] Spengler wants to show that



# **FINDINGS**

- Wells, without a doubt, contributed to the conversations of social degeneration and eugenics, significantly in Germany among other nations, "Wells concedes that Germany is 'by far the most efficient power in the world ... better equipped with the resources of modern science, and with her official and administrative classes at a higher level of education and training' (77)" (Sherborne 2). Although the Nazis would later burn works of science fiction like Wells', his nods towards the German nation were what likely got him invited "In 1929... back to give a lecture at the Reichstag" (Sherborne 3).
- Considering the popularity of social degenerative and eugenics theories, combined with the influence of Wells, makes it a safe bet to conclude that Wells' contributed (intentionally or not) to theories that were foundational for the most sinister event of the twentieth century: The Holocaust.

#### THE BIG PICTURE

When the Holocaust is discussed today, it's often spoken about as being caused primarily by general antisemtism; perhaps people will mention the 'Scapegoat' theory (Ludwig 4) or even the 'Backstab' of WWI (O'Malley). Less frequently do much deeper-seated theories like social degeneration and eugenics get discussed; and even more rarely are they connected to seemingly benign origins such as science fiction.

### **TAKEAWAYS:**

While it's difficult to establish firm connections when dealing with an event of such magnitude, this research has both established that

- a) Social degeneration and eugenics were popular pseudoscience theories of the early twentieth century. Both created heightened animosity towards minority groups such as the Jews and the disabled.
- b) Wells contributed to this conversation (inadvertently or not) via his works in science fiction, so...
- c) Considering that such sinister influences, that could contribute to such a tragic event, could come from seemingly benign places, we should <u>always</u> be aware of who we allow to have influence in our own lives.
